

A. Declaration for Invalid Pension.

On this 8th day of May 1865, personally appeared before me, a Just of a Court of Record, in the County and State aforesaid Perry H Landon aged 21 years, a resident of Chester town County of Kent in the State of Maryland who, being duly sworn, declares that he is the identical Perry H Landon who enlisted in the service of the United States at Baltimore in the State of Maryland on the 23 day of September 1863, as a Private in Company C commanded by 1st Lieut Wright no man in the 7th Regiment of Colored Volunteers in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the 5th day of May 1865. That while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, on or about the 29th day of September in the year of our Lord 1864, he was at the charge of Fort Harrison when he was wounded in the left fore arm which has since been amputated
Ability Total

He makes this application for a pension, provided by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862, and hereby appoints DARIUS FORBES, General Claim Agent of the United States Sanitary Commission, or his successor in office, of Washington, D. C., his lawful attorney, and authorizes him to present and prosecute this claim, and to receive and receipt for any orders or certificates that may be issued in satisfaction thereof.
