



Declaration for Children Under Sixteen Years of Age.

Act of June 27, 1890.

This Must be Executed Before a Court of Record or Some Officer Thereof Having Custody of its Seal.

State of Ma, County of Bull, ss:ON THIS 16 day of May, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety onepersonally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace court, a Courtof Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Augustus Bowenaged 51 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration inorder to obtain the pension provided by Act of Congress approved June 27, 1890: That he is the legal guardian ofAbram Bowen, John Thomas Bowen
