DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION

TO BE EXECUTED BEFORE A COURT OF RECORD OR SOME OFFICER THEREOF HAVING CUSTODY OF ITS SEAL.

aforsaid, M Martha Bowen, aged 32 years, a resident of

the City of Baltimore, county of Baltim, State of

Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow

of James E Bowen, who enlisted under the name of James E Bowen

at —, on the 23 day of October

A. D. 1863, in Co "D" - 7th U.S.C. Troops

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED

at Indianola Texas, and died May 31st 1864

That she was married under the name of Mary Martha Kell, to said

James E. Bowen, on the 21st day of December

1861, by Rev J. W. Waters, at Baltimore Md

there being no legal barrier to said marriage. his husband was a widower at

time of his marriage (If there was a former marriage of claimant or her husband, state it here and how dissolved.)

That she has not remarried since the death of the said James E Bowen
