I informed mother at the time that I had rec'd \$120 as Pension & kept out \$20 for my own use. I am sure that Mother & father (Jas Kell) will remember that I said \$120 - was all money paid me by Skinner. I have always thought & do now think that C. L. Skinner ~~has~~ took \$25 out of my first Pension Check or money as his fee for securing my Pension. No, I never knew the Pension office paid him or any one else a fee out of my money. I can not read or write.
