Which makes this Pensioner 71 years of age, according to my count, as the witness first knew the Pensioner Hawsell in 1841 - 20 years before the war when he was, as I said, - 3 to 4 years old. Will you be kind enough to enclose the blanks that I can fill out the proof he needs to put him on the fifteen dollar roll.
