in W.D. 111999 Civil War Claim of Jane Hensell, Widow of Madison Hensell,
late of Co. F. 9th Regt. U.S.C. Inf. I am well acquainted with the former
and made oath in due form of law that I am well acquainted with the former
wife of Madison Hensell who was Anna Hawkins,
who prior to her death, resided near where I
lived, this in Anna Arundel County Maryland
near Harmon Station, on coming to Baltimore City
her and her family had to pass my house, I do
know positively that on a certain day about four
o'clock in the morning my husband, "Sincere" and
myself were called up found the son of Anna Hensell,
who stated his mother was in the wagon, and very ill,
we brought her in our house, where she remained about 4 hours.
I arranged things to put in the wagon that she might be
comfortable on her way back home. She was unconscious,
a few days thereafter my things were returned. At the same
time being informed that Anna Hensell had died and
was buried, I then was a burial friend on her mother's part,
but do not know where Anna was buried or remember the date
her death or had the attack. Yet know this statement to be the fact
as personally known and remembered by me. I have been in Bal-
timore over twenty years and her death took place before I moved from
A.A. County Maryland. I further testify that I have no
interest in the claim.
