living near neighbors in St Mary, County Maryland.
 during our girlhood days her and I were intimate

 do I know of my own personal knowledge that she was
 married but three times, twice before her marriage
 to the deceased Soldier, her former marriages
 were dissolved prior to her latter marriage,
 her and the Soldier living together as Man and
 Wife from the date of their marriage till the death of
 the Soldier, they were never divorced, neither has
 the Claimant remarried since the death of her
 husband, who died leaving no minor child or children
 surviving under the age of sixteen years, which
 facts are personally known to me from my acquaintance
 and associations with the Claimant. I further testify that
