I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 89,844, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that William H. Butler was enrolled on the 16th day of January, 1864, at St Marys M^d in Co. "G", 7th Regiment of U S Col'd I. Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 16th day of January 1864, at Charles Co. M^d, in Co. "G", 7th Regiment of U S Col'd Infs Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "G" of that Regiment, for the months of September & October 1865, he is reported "Absent Sick Since June 1864"
