Sir:-

In response to your call of the 3rd ult. received on the 6th ult. (G.H.L. 319- 361.965) relative to the case William H. Butler, #1435 Ward St. Baltimore, Md. as of Co. G, 7th U. S. C. Vol. Inf., Inv. Ctf. #606,728, you are advised that in a declaration for pension executed by William H. Butler, Aug. 11, 1890 Emanuel Smith and Harrison Stanley both of Baltimore, Md., testified they were present and saw Wm. H. Butler sign his name to said declaration and that they have every reason to believe from the appearance of said Wm. H. Butler and their acquaintance with him for 25 years respectively that he is the identical person he represents himself to be.

Height of soldier given in Surgeon's Certificate of Disability filed Aug. 12, 1865 is 5 ft 4 in. This information is corroborated by a certificate of Medical examination on file dated March 5, 1891.

Wm. H. Butler died Sept. 5 1907 as shown by a report from United States Pension Agent.
