DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace.

personally appeared before me, a _____, within and for the City and State aforesaid, Frances Hayes, aged 65 years, a resident of City of BALTIMORE, State of MARYLAND

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of John W. Hayes, who enlisted under the name of _____

on the 23 day of March, A. D. 1864, as a private in Company C, in the 39 Regiment of U. S. Infantry Volunteers, and served at least ninety days in the late War

of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED 4th 1865

and died 23rd March November 29 1908. That he was not employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That he was never employed in the military or naval service of the United States after the day of _____, 18____. That she was married under the name of _____

to said John W. Hayes the 28 day of October A. D. 1858, by Rev. Joseph Young at Baltimore Md.

there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had not been previously married; that her said husband had not been previously married. (4)

That she has not remarried since the death of the said _____

That the names and dates of birth of all the children of the soldier, now living, and under sixteen years of age, are as follows:

That she has not abandoned the support of any one of her children, but that they are still under her care or maintenance. That no prior application for pension has been filed by herself or the soldier.

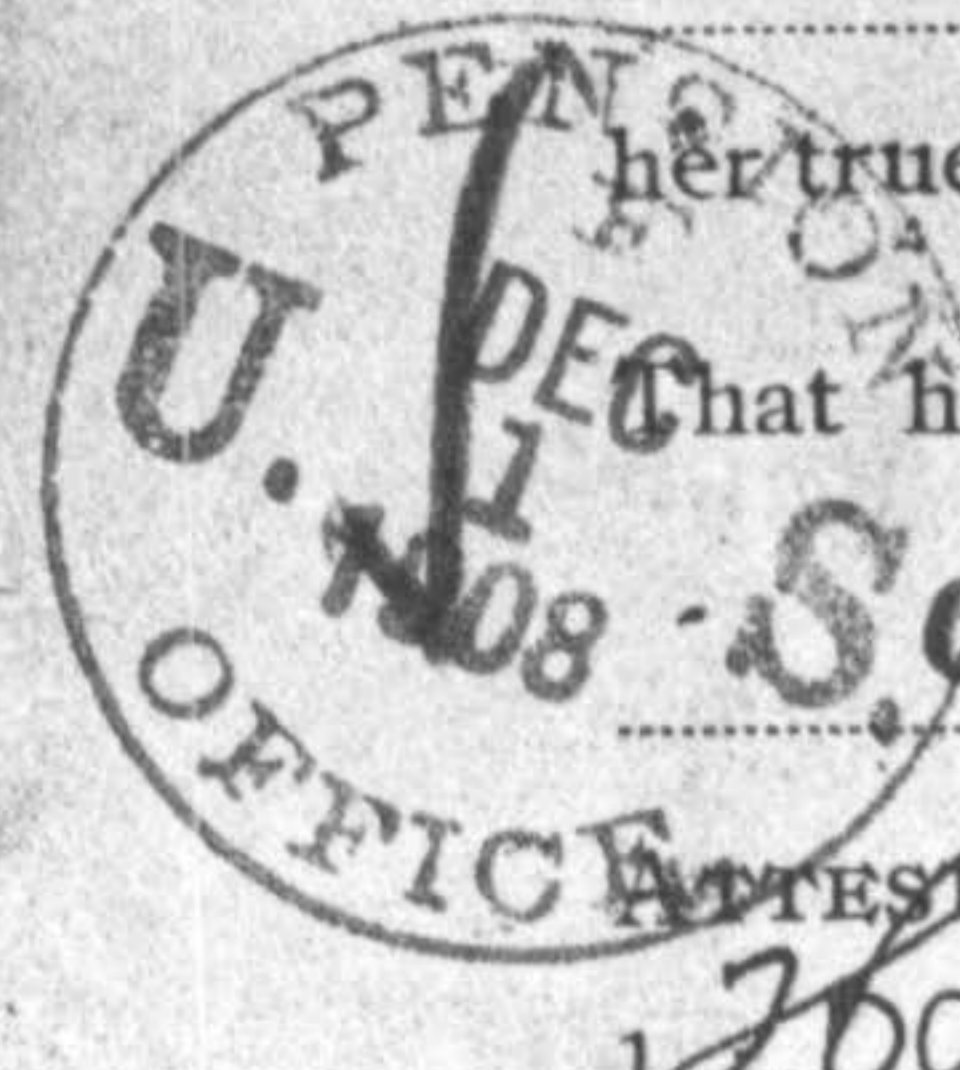

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of APR 19 1908, which was known as H. R. 15653 Sulloway Bill, and other acts granting pensions to widows for service aforesaid. She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, A. Parlett Lloyd

her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, the fee to be TEN DOLLARS, payable as prescribed by law.
