DEPOSITION *D.*Case of *Peter Mitchell*, No. *635,308*

On this *16* day of *July*, 1895, at
Baltimore, County of *St. Louis*,
 State of *Md*, before me, *Suberter*, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *Amos*
Jackson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am in 64th year. Resi-

dence 508 Bruce St - Baltimore Md. I work
 at any thing I am able. I am a pensioner
 I served in Co. H - 19th U.S. I.T.

I first met Peter Mitchell in the Army. We
 were brigaded together he in the 9th and I in
 the 19th U.S. I know he was in Hosp. at
 White House Landing Va. and at Brimfield
 Texas. but I dont know what his disability was
 then. He was discharged before I was. I didnt
 get home till ^{Jan.} ~~Jan.~~ 1867. We have both lived
 in Baltimore ever since and I see him often every
 year. and I know he has complained of a
 weakness of the eyes and deafness and
 rheumatism. On a cloudy day, you hear a
 rattle very loud to make him hear. He was
 laid up with rheumatism for over a year
 after he got out of the Army. for he was laid
 up in bed with it. up when I got home
 in March 1867 and I went to see him and
 it was over a year after I got home before
 he got out on the street.

I have been a witness for Mr Mitchell at
 Mr Loyds office once - It was about 3 years
 ago. I never was witness for him only once
 the affidavit was written at Mr Loyds
 new office Cor. St Paul. & Senalega Sts. I dont
 know the gentleman's name that wrote it.
