I have known Peter Mitchell since 1872. When I first knew him he lived in Welcome Alley and a part of the time in 1873 I lived in the same house with him and have lived in the same ward with him ever since. When I first knew Mitchell he was working as a hod carrier and has followed that business off and on ever since. During the time I have known Mitchell he has been suffering with severe attacks of head troubles. He would have severe attacks of pains in his head confining him to his bed for a week and more at a time. He has had those attacks two or three times each year to my knowledge. We visit each other back and forth, in fact we are married to Sisters and our wives are constantly visiting back and forth. Those attacks generally affects his eyes very much and he complains right smart of his eyes. I do not know what the doctor pronounced the disease of head, I cannot say who has been his doctors. I do not know of any other trouble that Mitchell has had. Yes sir, I testified for him.
