Case of *Peter Mitchell*, No. *635,308*

On this *28<sup>th</sup>* day of *February*, 1894, at  
*Baltimore*, County of *\_\_\_\_\_*  
 State of *MD.*, before me, *GEO. D. SIMAN*, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *John H. Davis*,  
 who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says:

*Age* *54 years.*  
*Occupation* *Teamster.*  
*Residence* *# 911 Essex St. Baltimore, MD.*  
 I served during the war in *Co. H 9<sup>th</sup> M.S.C.*  
 and I knew *Peter Mitchell* as orderly *Sgt.*  
*of my Company.* I first knew him in the  
*war.* I remember that just after the  
 battle of *Sept. Bottom* he in the fall of  
*1864* *Sgt. Mitchell* was quite sick  
 and complained of his head and eyes, I  
 was discharged in 1865 before the Company  
 was mustered out. I have lived in  
*Baltimore* ever since the war and have  
 seen *Mitchell* as often as once or twice  
 each year. I have applied for pension  
 but have not received any pension yet.  
*Mitchell* testified for me and I testified  
 for him. I went to the *Comb Home*  
*Co. of St. Paul and Lexington Sts.* and gave  
 my testimony. I do not remember when  
 that was. I simply testified to knowing  
*Mitchell* as in my regiment. *Mitchell*  
 and I went there together. I do not  
 remember anyone else with us. I know  
 that *Mitchell* has been sick twice since  
 the war but I cannot say what way
