

swear me. I have been sworn in Lloyd's office  
by a Magistrate there but I don't know his  
name. I was also sworn once at an office  
of a Magistrate right opposite the Court House.  
I was once at the Court House but that was to  
give testimony in some other case. I don't think  
I ever went there to be sworn in any own case.  
I don't remember now why I went there. I  
cannot say now where Davis and I went together  
but I remember he was a witness for me once.  
I never made any written agreement with Mr  
Lloyd as to fees. I understand he gets \$40<sup>00</sup>  
from the government for his fee in getting my pension.  
I don't remember that I ever signed a yellow  
paper at Lloyd's, but that is my signature you show  
me. (See agreement). I never made any agreement to  
pay Mr Lloyd \$25<sup>00</sup> for any purpose, and I cannot  
understand that agreement. That paper as that  
was now read to me, and I never understood how  
my first pension was made to commence in May  
1891 when I know I had applied in Aug or Sept  
1890. That is my signature to the paper you show  
me. (Declarator June 26/90) I cannot identify that  
paper as the first one I signed - I am sure I  
did not make any claim until after the war  
had been passed. I remember I went somewhere  
with Geo W Davis once but I cannot say that Rice  
was with me then. That is my signature to  
the paper you show me (Declarator Mar 13, 1891) I  
never know Mr Lloyd's office but I have no recollection  
that he ever sworn me to any paper.
