

I remember of making the affidavit of July 26-27, 1891
which you now show me. I think I was sworn that
affidavit by J. Magruder Tubman, who has an office
a few doors below Lloyd's Office. I distinctly remember
that Mr Tubman has sworn me to papers there, &
his office. I was there, when De Shields and Evans
testified and that is the time they identified me. I do
not remember when or by whom they were sworn. I do
not know who swore Jackson and Marshall because I
was not there when they testified.

I have no knowledge when I was applied under the
old law and I am positive I never made any
agreement to pay Lloyd \$25⁰⁰, and I never had
any talk of that kind with Lloyd or any of his
clerks. I evidently signed that agreement but I
did not know what I was signing if I did.
Since my pension was allowed I have always
got my vouchers executed and checks cashed at
Lloyd's office, for which Lloyd charges me 50¢ each
quarter. J. Magruder & Lloyd always swore me to my vouchers.
I fully understand the contents of this deposition.
