

Claim No. 761574 of Isaac Brooks late private of Company E Regiment, 19th - 27th Volunteers.

State of Maryland, City of Baltimore.

On this 22 day of August A. D. 1890, before me, a JUSTICE OF THE PEACE in and for the State and City aforesaid, personally appeared George Brooks and Richard Wolff residing at No. 814 Woodyear St. No. 933 Harmony Lane City of Baltimore, State of Maryland to me well known, and whom I certify to be respectable and intelligent, and entitled to full credit and belief, and who being duly sworn according to law and thus depose: My age is 57 years and I reside as above stated.

We served in Co E 19th U. S. C. I. We know that at or near Petersburg Va June 1864 our former comrade Isaac Brooks sprained his groin causing rupture thereof and also that near Brownsville Texas Summer 1865 he contracted malarial rheumatism and that all during rest of his service he suffered from said disabilities the symptoms of which we personally observed

We are not related to him in any manner

and I have no interest in the above designated claim.
