DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

Act of May 1, 1920.

STATE OF Maryland, COUNTY OF Baltimore, ss:

On this 3rd day of August, 1921, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Annie M. Heath, who, being duly sworn by me according to law, declares that she is 60 years of age and that she was born January 15th, 1861 at Accomac Co., Virginia

That she is the widow of Jacob Heath, who enlisted December 9th, 1863 at Unknown, under the name of Jacob A. Heath, as a Sergeant in Co. C. 19th Colored Inf. Infantry

and was honorably discharged January 15th, 1867, having served ninety days or more, or was discharged for or died in service of a disability incurred in the service and in the line of duty, during the CIVIL WAR.

That he also served _____ (Here give a complete statement of all other military, naval, or coast guard service, if any, at whatever time rendered.)

That she was married to said soldier (or sailor) June 6th, 1900, under the name of Annie Wiley, at Baltimore Maryland by Rev. John H. Roberts; that she had not been previously married, that he had been previously married to Florence C. and that neither she nor said soldier (or sailor) was ever married otherwise than as stated above. None (If any former husband rendered military or naval service, here describe same and give number of any pension claim based thereon.)

That said soldier (or sailor) died July 24th, 1911, at Baltimore Maryland, that she was not divorced from him, and that she has not remarried since his death.

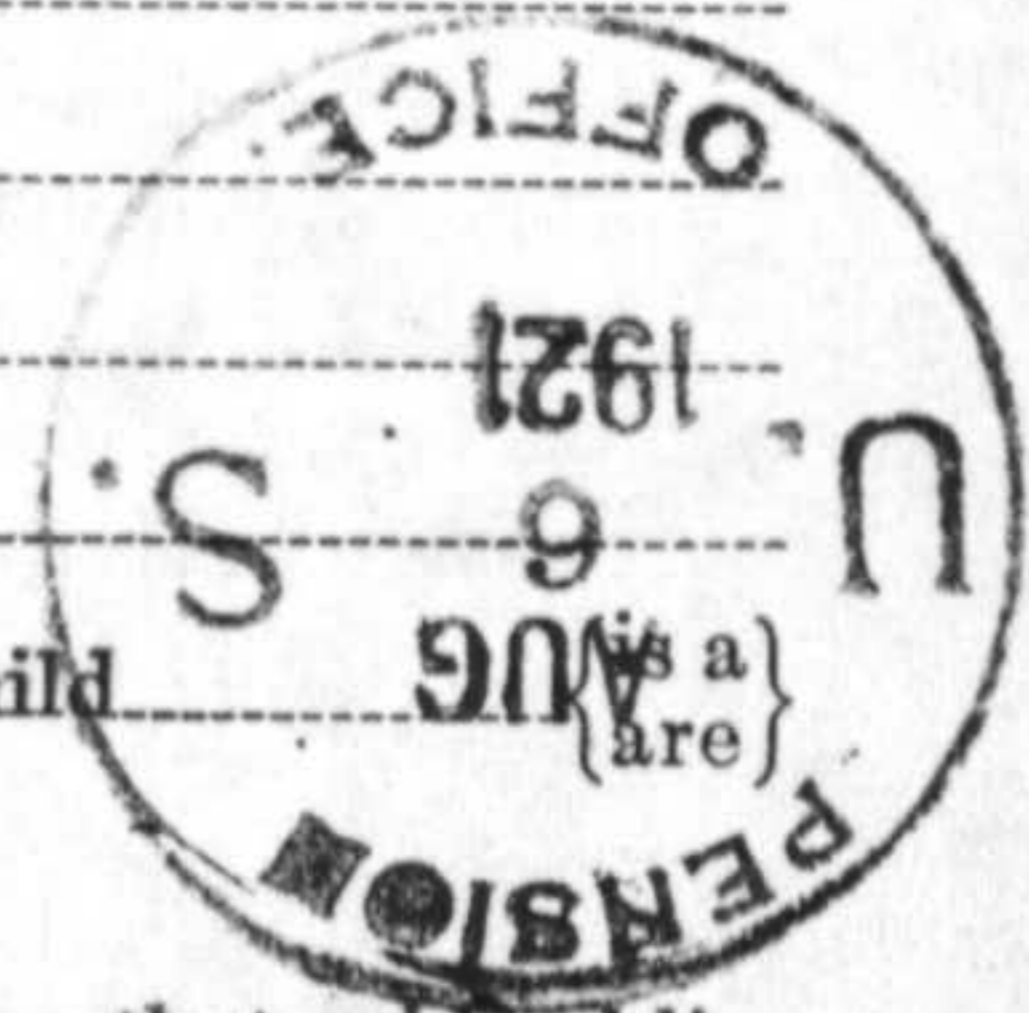
