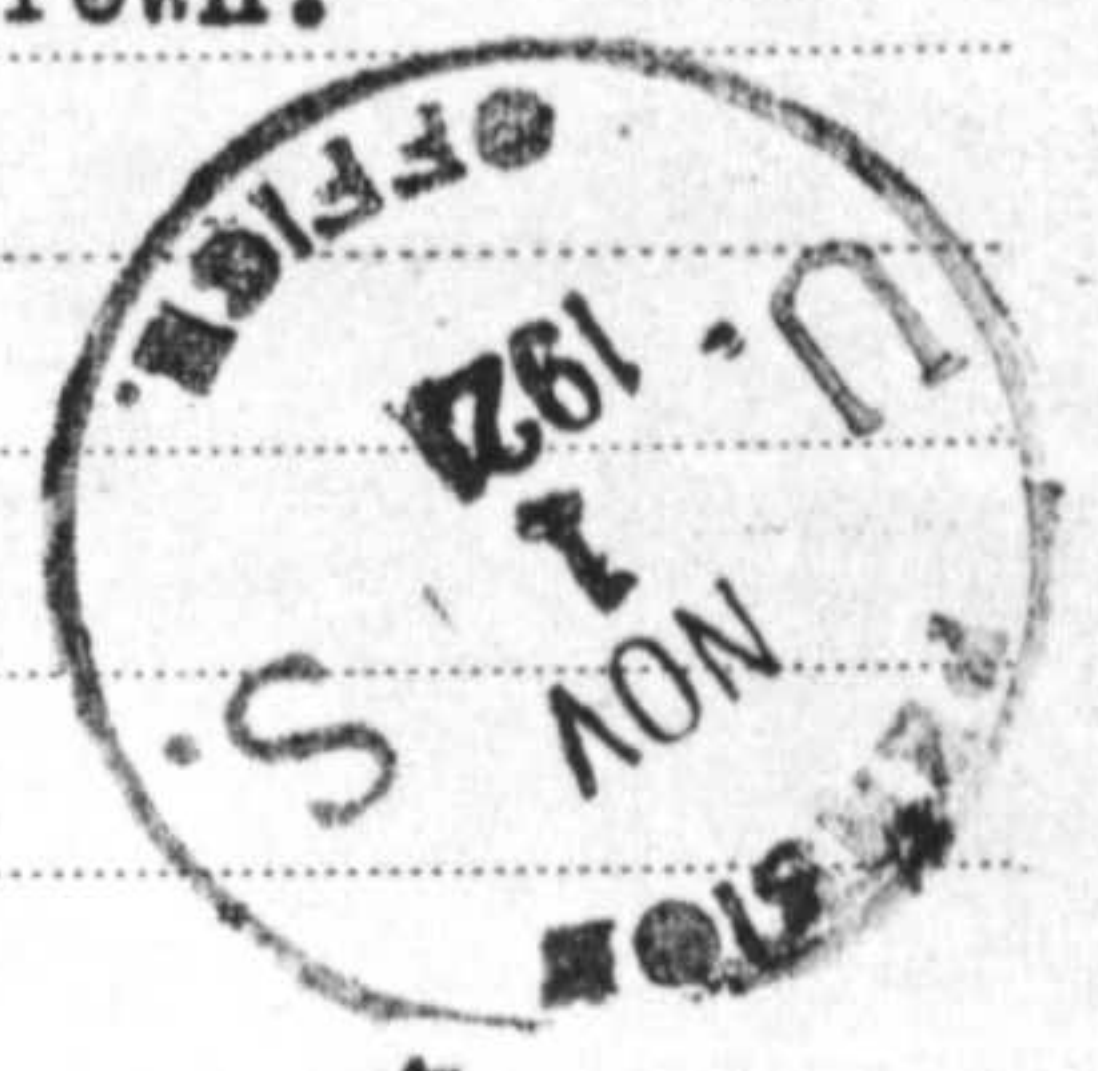

I was acquainted with Jacob Heath from my childhood up until the day of his death, 24th July 1921. I knew him when he married Fredericka Elizabeth Brown who died May 19th, 1884, and when he married Harriett Bordley who died in 1898, and also when he married Siedona Masen who died February 14th, 1900, and when he married the applicant and up until the time of his death, I am positive he had no other wife but those named and that Jacob Heath and the applicant, Annie M. Heath, lived together as man and wife from the date of their marriage, June 6th, 1900, until the date of his death July 24th, 1921, and that they were never divorced.

My knowledge of the above is derived from the fact that I was the brother of his first wife, Fredericka Elizabeth Brown.
