

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

as follows:

In regard to the widow of Jacob Heath, Annie M. Heath, would say
that I lived with her for about four years, more or less, in our very
early life. When a girl, and before my knowledge of her, she was known
by the name of Annie M. Satchell, although never married she assumed the
name of Dailey after she left me. I legally married shortly afterwards
on the 14th Dec. 1886 to Mary M. Dailey who died November 18th, 1905,
I afterwards married Mary C. Harris on April 8th, 1908 and I am still
living with her at this date. Annie M. Satchell or Dailey, who left me
in 1886 remained single to my personal knowledge as I was acquainted with her,
until after my marriage to Mary M. Dailey, (ten years and over) I am
convinced from my association and acquaintance with her, that Jacob Heath
was her only legal husband and from the time of his marriage until his
death they lived together as man and wife.
