DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

The Pension Certificate SHOULD NOT Be Forwarded With the Application.

On this 2nd day of April, A. D., one thousand nine hundred and seven, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county City and State aforesaid, Frederick Gray, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is 63 YEARS OF AGE, and resident of Baltimore City county, State of Maryland; and that he is the identical person who was ENROLLED at Baltimore City under the name of Frederick Gray, on the 1st day of May, 1862 as a Private, in 39th Inf. U.S.A.

D.C., their successors or legal representatives, his true and lawful attorneys to prosecute his claim under said law; and agrees that they shall be paid such fee or compensation as may be declared allowable by law, ruling or decision.

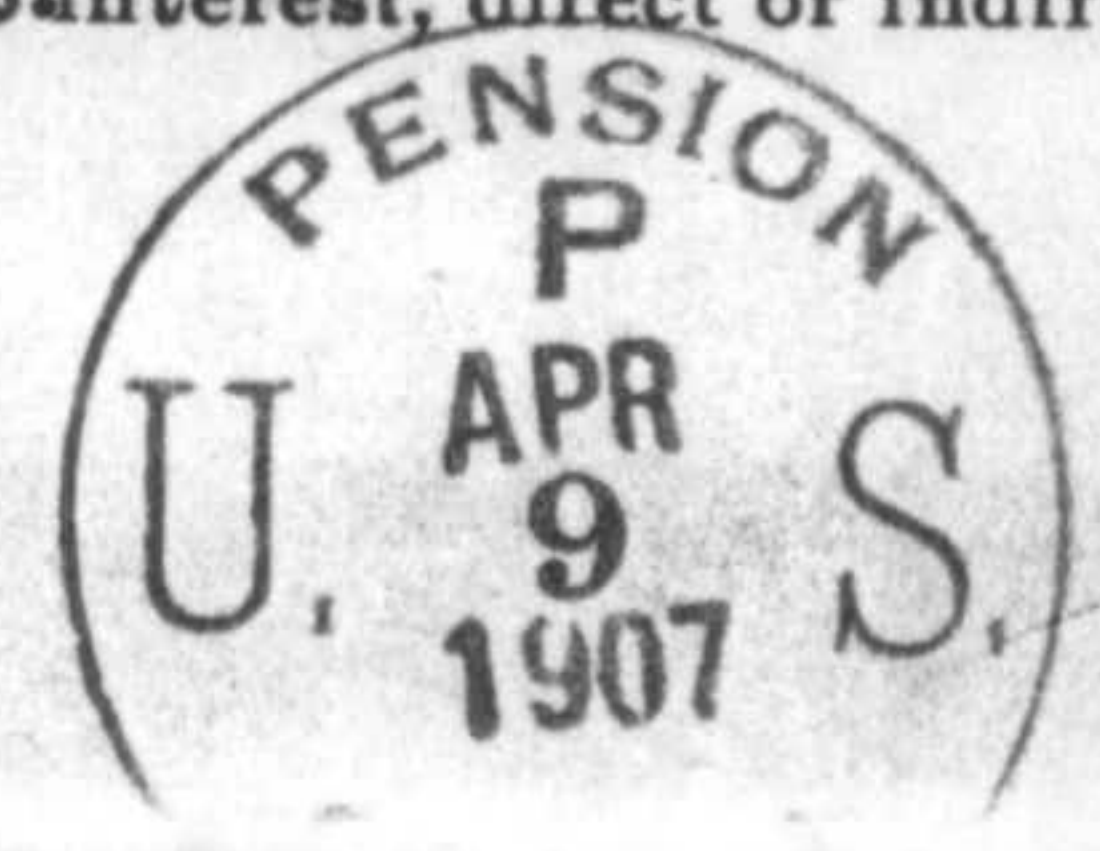
