

DEPOSITION

Case of Olga Ross, No. 659,012

On this 21 day of Feb. 1895, at Baltimore, Md., before me, N. M. Kille, a special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared James Bayard (red) who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: That his age is 62 years; post-office address, 4 N. Street at City, Md.; occupation, white-collar

I have known Olga Ross about 15 years. They did come to Baltimore (she and her husband Jack Ross) they attend in vicinity of Car Lane from me. I know Ross about the same length of time, but a little before I know her, as he and I belonged to the same church. Now I find her hair is much thicker than his appearance. As he was 50 or 60 years of age - she was a good deal younger, probably 35 years. I do not know that either of them was ever personally married but I think he has a child that is not his - she has this child before they were married. I know nothing personally about their marriage. He came from Cleveland, I do not know that he has been

personally married. They lived on Street at near the street when they separated. I could not tell the cause of their separation, but I understand he was engaged at that time. I understand that they made friends - they were never divorced that I know or ever heard. The fact was that Ross married <sup>the woman</sup> and she has been in town and she has been married since she was first known to me.
