

DECLARATION FOR ORIGINAL PENSION OF A WIDOW-CHILD OR CHILDREN UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE SURVIVING.

Act of July 14, 1862, and Supplemental Acts Amending Thereof.

On this 14th day of April, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, Eliza Jackson, widow of James A. Jackson, within and for the County and State aforesaid,

aged 70 years, a resident of Baltimore City, Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the pension provided by Act of Congress granting pensions to widows, approved Feb. 22, 1862, and supplemental acts amendatory thereof, to wit:
