

Jackson was his failure to pay the house rent and support her. I saw him living with no other women. I have lived in this city all of my life or close to the city. I knew personally of Amos Jackson coming to see Eliza Jackson three times from the Soldiers Home. She has not remarried since his death, we have lived two or three squares apart for fourteen years and I see her every week and sometimes every day. She lived with no other man as his housekeeper or mistress after Mr Jackson got to straying off, or after he went to the Home. I have no interest in this claim, and not related to claimant. I knew of her living with no man openly prior to her marriage to Amos Jackson. It was in three or four after the war I guess when she and I became acquainted. Your questions were understood and my answers are recorded correctly in this deposition which I have heard read. "One" interlined in line 10 before signing.
