I have the honor to forward the attached letter of complaint

to the Bureau, in claim W.O 1,031,133 (et number not known) Eliza

Jackson, widow of Amos Jackson Co - U.S. Col Troops, and also the

deposition of the complainant, Mary J. Ford, pensioner's daughter, for

consideration of Chief, Law Division, and such action as may be deemed

proper. I recall examining this claim and that I found claimant to

be crippled and helpless, and I believe that I recommended that a guar-

anty be appointed to disburse the pension if it was allowed, and it is

possible that she is not receiving the full benefit of the pension, the

complainant seeming to be truthful and much wrought up in the matter.
