Madam:

In view of the fact that the Federated Charities is interested in the claim for pension of Eliza Jackson, #557 W. Biddle St., your city, I have to advise you that she was granted a pension the sixth instant at the rate of \$12 per month from July 15, 1914 under certificate #794,555.

During the course of the examination of the claim it was found that she exhibited evidence of a weak or failing mind and that she requires the attendance of another person to assist her in preparing her food and in dressing.

In that state of the case her attorney, David L. Stanton, #423 N. Paca St., your city, was advised of the necessity of having her placed under committee ship in order that the pension may be properly used for her support and maintenance. The Committee should give a bond of at least \$300.

The form upon which the certificate of the appointment of the committee should be presented to this Bureau, preparatory to making payment of the pension, was forwarded to the attorney.
