

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION

ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.

To be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes in the State, city, or county where said officer resides. If such officer has a seal and uses it upon such paper, no certificate of a county clerk or prothonotary or clerk of a court shall be necessary; but when no seal is used by the officer before whom the declaration is executed, then a clerk of a court of record or a county or city clerk shall affix his official seal thereto, and shall certify to the signature and official character of said officer.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, SS: On this 18th day of January, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety one

personally appeared before me, a Notary Public in and for the State of Maryland, James Jordan aged 43 years, a resident of the County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law,

declares that he is the identical James Jordan who was enrolled on the 29th of February, 1864, in Co. B "38th Regt. U.S. Inf." Here state rank, company, and regiment in military service, or

discharged April 15th 1864 transferred to the U.S. Army promoted to Major in the U.S. Army in the service of the United States in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was

honorable discharged at New York City and from the U.S. Army, on the 15th of November, 1866 That he is totally unable to earn a support

by manual labor by reason of Chronic Rheumatism, Bleed disease, Kidney trouble, Palsy in head and liver disease Here name the diseases or injuries from which disabled.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief of a permanent character; that he has applied for pension under application No. not given that he is a pensioner under Certificate No. that he has not been employed If a pensioner, the certificate number only need be given; if not, give the number of the former application, if it was made. That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Charles B. Baulie of Baltimore City, State of Maryland, his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, and to receive therefor a fee of ten dollars; that his post-office address is 1413 French Alley Baltimore County of Baltimore State of Maryland
