(near Preston) aged 53 years by occupation a "Hod Carrier" &
who having been duly sworn says he was a "Coal Passer" in the
United States Navy and shipped at Annapolis & just went on the
U.S.S New Hampshire, then Steam Tug Owen Pettit then Linnaeus) I
was with James Jordan on the Steamer New Hampshire in
1864 he the said Jordan was in the sick bed he was there
a long time I do not know his Complaint - I know that
he were discharged (not from the same vessel as he were on dif-
ferent ones) near the same time some two or three months dif-
ference I saw Jordan when he returned to Baltimore
he was suffering with Rheumatism he was lame I could
notice that, I saw him two or three times a week, he could
not work, I knew him intimately & also know he still
has Rheumatism I know he is confined to his bed I have
visited him while so sick - he is now frequently con-
fined to his house - he lives at least one half of
his time. I have no interest in this case.
