DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

This must be Executed before a Court of Record or some Officer thereof having Custody of its Seal.

State of *Maryland* County of *Baltimore*, ss:

ON THIS *22nd* day of *August* A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety

personally appeared before me, *a justice of the Peace of the City* Court; a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid *Valentine Jones* aged *61* years, a resident of *Baltimore* county of _____ State of *Maryland*

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical *Valentine Jones* who was Enrolled on the _____ day of *March* 1864 in *Private* in *Company F 39 Regiment Infantry Col Bal* (Here state rank, company and regiment in the Military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.)

in the **War of the Rebellion** and served at least **ninety days**, and was **Honorably Discharged** at *Wilmington N.C.* on the *4th* day of *December* 1865.

That he is _____ unable to earn a support by reason of *Tumor and Abscess* (Partially or wholly.) (Here name the diseases or injuries from which disabled.)

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief **permanent**.

That he has _____ applied for pension under application No. _____ That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. *He applied for pension the first of the summer.
