SIR:

Your inquiry of November 29th, 1882, in Pension Claim No. 422,757, is herewith returned, with the following information:

Benjamin Welsh was enrolled on the 18th day of May, 1864, at Baltimore Co. Md., as a Private-1st. in Co. D, 19th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years.

He is reported on Muster Roll for May & June, 64, present for duty, "Joined Co. June 7, 1864", July & Aug. absent, "Sick in Hospital since Aug. 7, 64", Aug. 31 to Dec. 31, absent, "Wounded and in H. Hosp. since July 30, 1864"; Dec. 31, 64 to Dec. 31, 66, present for duty. He was mustered out of service with Co. January 15th, 1867 at Brownsville, Texas, as Benjamin Welsh. Co. Descriptive Book shows him "Wounded in action at Petersburg, Va. July 30, 64. Co. morning report Feby. 22, 65, reports him, from sick in H. Hosp. to duty in Company. The records of this office do not show nature or location of wound.
