Origin.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence before us
it is our belief that the said disability did originate in the
service aforesaid in the line of duty.

Probable duration.

The disability is permanent

Particular description.

A more particular description of the applicant's condition is subjoined:

Height, 5-11; weight, 150; complexion, Ric
age, 37; pulse, 81; respiration, 17SWARM - a cicatrix on anterior border of right
cervical triangle (in front of sternocleidomastoid muscle).
Two molars on right side have dropped out,
he says the result of ulceration from wound.
The buccinator on right prevents the natural
closure of jaws - Rate (1/2) \$4Superficial cicatrix posterior aspect left elbow joint
no disability - also one over left malar bone
same character - which he calls 'Left eye' -
no rating.
