as follows:

That I was a private in Co. F. 39th Col. T.

And I distinctly remember Edward Parker who was a private in same Co & Regt as myself and also distinctly remember that the said Edward Parker was present with his Company on or about Feb. 11th 1865 and that the said Edw. Parker was wounded whilst said Company was engaged in skirmishing in front of the Rebel works near Sugar Loaf Battery W.C. I distinctly remember the said Edw. Parker going into the fight (he being on my right) and know him to have been wounded in said fight from the fact that I found him suffering from wounds in the arm & neck immediately after said fight, and must have received them during that fight as he was perfectly sound just before the said engagement, all of which I distinctly remember.
