who came to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case
as follows:

I was 1st Sergt of Co F 39th Regt U.S. Col. d.

I distinctly remember Edward Parker who was
a private in same Co & Regt as myself. I also
remember that the said Parker was present with
his Co in Feb. 1865 at the time of the fight
near Sugar Loaf Battery N.C. I was absent from
the Co sick, when I rejoined the Co a few days
afterward I found the said Edward Parker
disabled and suffering with a wound in his
neck when I sent him to the Hospital
near Raleigh N.C. by direction of the Co Commander

I further declare that I have no interest in said case and I am not concerned in

its prosecution.
