SIR:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of May 2nd, 1881, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for Pension No. 335,801 and to return it herewith, with the following information from the records of this office:

It appears from the Rolls of U. S. Colored Troops on file in this office that Edward Parker was enrolled on the 6th day of May, 1864, at Brooklyn N.Y., in Co. 39th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private (Rec't) on the 6th day of May, 1864, at Brooklyn N.Y., in Co. 39th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "F" of that Regiment, for the months of from Aug 31st 64 to Feb 28th, 1865, he is reported present for duty, March & April "absent sick in Dis Hosp't April 14th 65." May & June present for duty, with remarks "Returned to duty June 10th 65." from June 30th to Oct 31st present for duty.

He was mustered out of service with Co at Wilmington N.C. Dec 4th 1865.

No evidence of alleged wounds on the records on file in this office.
