

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

ON THIS 30 day of May A. D. 1883, personally appeared before me a

Commissioner of Deeds for the District of Columbia in Maryland

Edward Parker aged 46 years, a resident of Baltimore

in the County of Baltimore and State of Maryland

well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case

as follows: That three years prior to his enlistment he resided at Ball's
Crop Roads V^e being then a slave and worked as house hand. since
his discharge from the Army he resided principally in Baltimore City
except about four years that he lived in Easton, Talbot Co. Md. resides
now at 104 Sarah Ann Street, Baltimore, Md. his post office
address is that place. He cannot give the different houses he has
lived in for the past 17 winter years or cannot recollect the dates of
changes of his residences. Was wounded at Battle of Sugar Loaf
& Fades Station N. C. Was first treated for wound in neck, by Dr. Rider
now living at 195 N. Front St. Balt. - said wound has caused
him, and now cause, almost continual pain and misery especially
the wound in the mouth. Has frequently since discharge
been obliged to lose time from work on account of his
wounds - amounting in some instances to eight months
in the year.
