

DECLARATION FOR AN ORIGINAL INVALID PENSION.

This must be Executed before a Court of Record or some Officer thereof having Custody of the Seal.

On this 10th day of January, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty
 personally appeared before me John Beck of the Superior Court a Court
 of Record within and for the county and State aforesaid, Edward Parker

aged 38 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical
Edward Parker who was ENROLLED on the 6th day of
May, 1864 in company F of the 39th regiment of U.S. Col. Troops
 commanded by Captain F. Dodge, and was honorably DISCHARGED at
Baltimore on the Decemb day of 1865, that his

personal description is as follows: Age, 38 years; height, 5 feet 8 inches; complexion, Black
 hair, Black; eyes, Black. That while a member of the organization aforesaid, in the
 service and in the line of his duty at Superior Battery, in the State of North Carolina
 on or about the 11th day of February, 1865, he while in line of

Battle with his regiment, storming the Battery, which was captured.
 of wound or injury. If disabled by disease, state fully its cause; if by wound or injury, the precise manner in which received.
was struck by a Minnie Ball, in the right side of the neck, near
the jugular vein, breaking a piece off the jaw bone and knocking out
several teeth from the lower jaw, causing a permanent impediment
to his speech. was then struck by a Minnie ball in the right arm,
the ball entering near the elbow affecting the locomotion and
strength of the arm. also at the same time received a gun shot
wound in the left eye, the ball passing along and cutting a
portion of the left ear.

That he was treated in hospitals as follows: first on the field - at Fair Station.
 Here state the names or numbers, and the localities of all hospitals in which treated, and the dates of treatment.
then carried in ambulance to Raleigh N.C. where he was
treated in Hospital, from there to Hospital at Fort Schuyler
N.York.

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.
 Here state what the service
was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.

That since leaving the service this applicant has resided in the City of Baltimore
 in the State of Maryland, and his occupation has been that of a cook
 That prior to his entry into the service above named, he was a man of good, sound, physical health, being when enrolled a

cook. That he is now disabled from
 obtaining his subsistence by manual labor, by reason of his injuries, above described, received in the service of the
 United States; and he therefore makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the invalid pension
 roll of the United States. He hereby appoints with full power of substitution and revocation,
