I did not see him from the time he left Baltimore with his company until he was discharged and came home.

Q Was George W Harris's father living at the time he enlisted?

A No, sir, he died in Baltimore Md, cannot give the date, I cannot tell you how long it was before George enlisted that his father died.

Q Were you legally married to George's father?

A No sir.

Q Who was your husband at the time George enlisted?

A Jamett Baeveman. He was a Methodist Minister.

Q When and where did you marry Jamett Baeveman?

A In Charlestown Va (or rather in the country near said place). I cannot give the date. I married him in Slavery times. I married him when George was only about five or six years of age.

Q What was your maiden name?

A Harris. George was born in Slavery times, and was what is known as an illegitimate child. I was never married to his father.

Q Was George W Harris, your son
