Q What was the largest amount your son George ever sent, or gave you, after you left Baltimore?

A He never sent or gave me more than three dollars at any one time. He was sick a long time and could not work and had little to support himself with. He did not send me any money for several years prior to his death. I had to send him money to help him along.

He got behind in his Society and G. A. R. Past, and when he died they would not bury him on that account, so I had to furnish the money to bury him with as I have stated. I have no means of support now, and all the property I own, is this little house, and the lot it stands on. I am supported by my daughter who takes in washing.
