1887, addressed to the Commissioner of Pensions, in which he speaks of his family as being sick and in need of money. How do you explain that part which refers to his family?

A I cannot; He had no wife and no children when he died, and had had none since Olivia's death. Just before his death he lived or boarded with Dan Lawry's wife, whose maiden name was Martha Baker, both are dead now. She was separated from her husband, but my son was not married to her. In April 1895, when I went before the Squire in Baltimore Md and made an affidavit, he told me that a woman, he did not know had been to see him, to get my son's pension, and he threatened to have her arrested, I don't know who she was. My answers to questions asked have been correctly recorded in this deposition,
