I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 98,645, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Charles E. Smith was enrolled on the 21st day of March, 1864, at Baltimore, City in Co. "A", 39th Regiment of U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 22nd day of March 1864, at Baltimore, Md., in Co. "A", 39th Regiment of U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "A" of that Regiment, for the months of March & April 1865, he is reported "Died at U. S. Genl Hospital Fortress Monroe, Va. Mar. 9. 1865." (Cause of death not stated. A burial)
