My name is Geo. B. Shannon, I am 34 years old, and I reside in Baltimore, Md., at No. 1442 Preston Street. I have

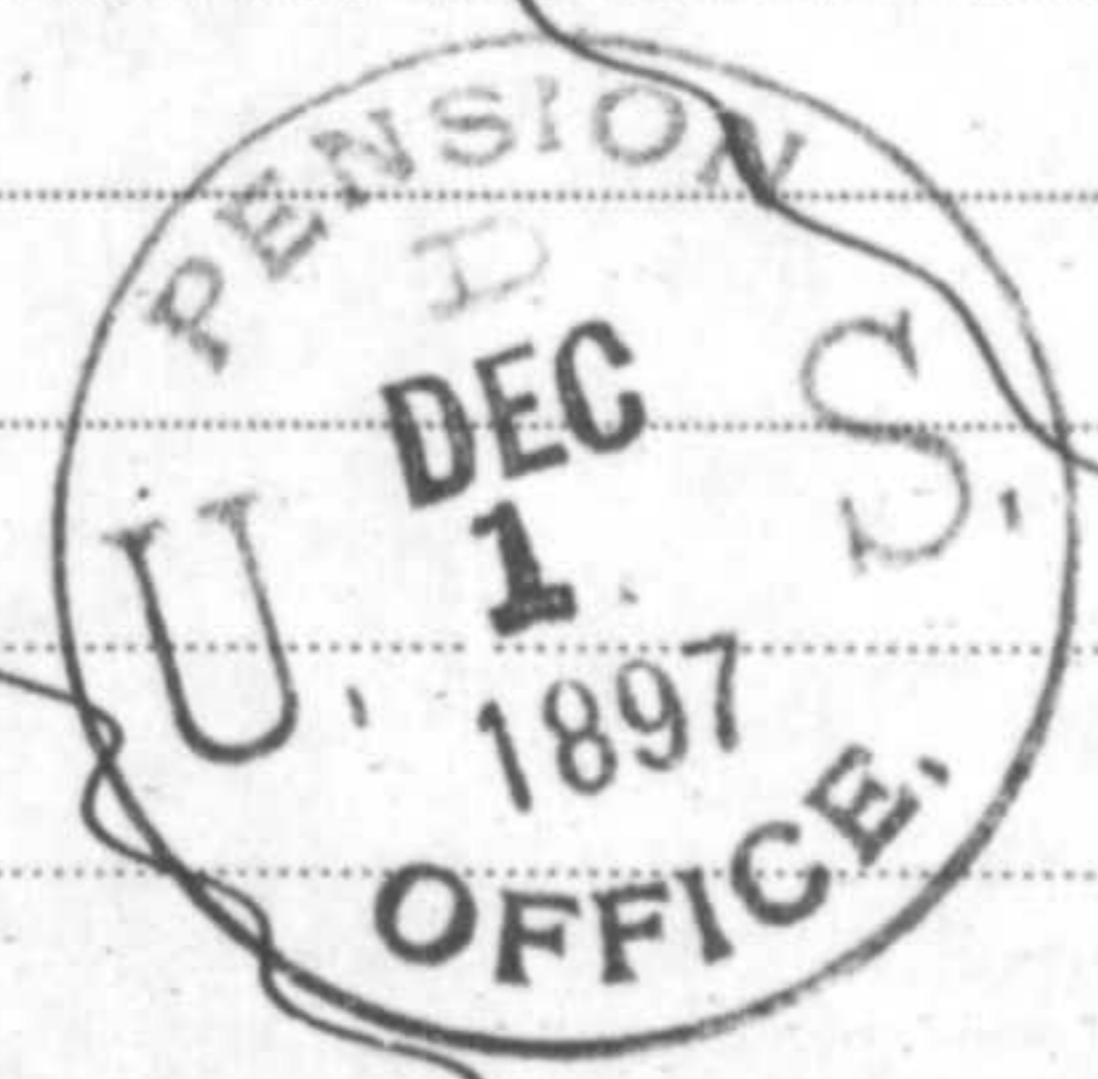
been a practitioner of medicine for 14 years and have been acquainted with the soldier, Perry Dixon 1813 Lorman St for about 2 years, and that
