

has been mainly home treatment, for if
 I had employed a physician it would
 have cost me a good part of what I made.
 Dr. H. W. Owings, Madison, and lately deceased,
 was my attending physician until his death.
 His son Dr. E. R. Owings has treated me for my
 hardness of hearing, but with no real good result.
 I would state here that at but rare intervals
 have I ever employed a physician outside of
 the two mentioned above. I was attended in
 Cleveland once and at Niagara Falls once
 but I have forgotten the names of those physicians
 as they were only temporary.

My disability commenced about the latter
 part of June or the first of July at a place in
 Virginia, we called the Fish ponds. I was attacked
 with the Intermittent Fever which eventually
 left me with Chronic Rheumatism and Bron-
 chitis. I was first taken to the Field Hospital
 from there to City Point, and from there to
