T. from his enlistment to the present I know of his drifting from the time he was taken sick at the fort in Ponder in Virginia in 1864 He left the regiment at that time for the Hospital where he remained for sometime, to the best of my belief he was suffering from some kind of throat trouble and chronic rheumatism. I have seen him frequently since that time, and believe him to be still suffering from those diseases
