"My age is *55* years, I reside in Baltimore, Md., at No. *845 Boyd* Street,

My name is *Rosetta Murphy*. I am only related to claimant by marriage. I married his cousin. I have known claimant since his childhood. I lived next door to him when he returned from the army and saw him then. He was suffering with throat and lung trouble. He complained of his throat a great deal and had a slight hacking cough. I have seen him frequently off and on each year since his discharge in Dec 1865 & know that he has continued to suffer with said throat and lung trouble during each year to the present time and has not been free from same. His cough has continued each year to the present. He has at times been laid up and unable to labor by reason of his throat & lung trouble and has also been complaining of rheumatism.

These statements are made orally to *F. E. Newton*, who wrote them, at *Balt, Md.*, June 3/95 & in making them I was not aided or guided by any statement prepared or dictated by any other person.
