He makes the following statement upon which he bases his claim for Orig. [Original, increase, restoration, &c.]

Here give the claimant's statement as briefly and as compactly as possible.

Cough at times, Pain in Legs. Thick mucus comes up from Throat.

Upon examination we find the following objective conditions: Pulse rate, 80; respiration, 19; temperature, 98.4; height, 5 feet 6 inches; weight, 138 pounds; age, 53 years.

A full description of the disabilities, in accordance with pars. 5, 6, 51, 52, &c., of Book of Instructions for 1889

Bronchitis - no rales or crepitations - nothing but his statement. (see Dis. Lungs)

Dis. of Throat - Catarrh of Larynx and pharynx (atrophic in form) - veins show very distinct in numerous points.

Dis. Lungs - measurements 31 and 33 - no rales resonance increased probably from bronchial dilatation - no points of dullness - This maybe bronchitis.

Deafness - ordinary conversation heard with very little difficulty - L. Ear - watch heard only on spec - inspection reveals nothing - probably catarrhal -

Rheumatism - claims pain in thighs and legs - no abnormality found.

Heart - apex impulse seen plainly in normal - no murmurs - prolonged systolic sound (rather double systolic sound) - dullness slightly increased towards the right.

Rate for EACH cause of disability.

He is, in our opinion, entitled to a 4/18 rating for the disability caused by Bronchitis, 4/18 for that caused by Dis. Throat (catarrh), and no rating for that caused by Dis. Lungs. no rating for Deafness - no rating for Rheumatism.
