*Regl. Returns for Jan'y, March and May, 64 do not report them absent.*

*Regl. Returns for Jan'y 64 shows Regt. 26<sup>th</sup> Dis. 78. Co<sup>o</sup> at Yorktown Va. & Co<sup>o</sup> F. & D. at Ft. Wagner Va.; Feb 64. 26<sup>th</sup> Dis. & 8. Co<sup>o</sup> at Yorktown Va. & Co<sup>o</sup> F. & D. near Williamsburg Va.; March 64. Regiment at Yorktown Va.; Apl. 64 at Camp Hamleton Va. May 4<sup>th</sup> at City Point Va. May 29<sup>th</sup> crossed the Appomattox; 30<sup>th</sup> advanced two miles & worked several days on fortifications at Bermuda; June 15 in action in front of Petersburg Va. and there stationed to June 30/64.*
