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a sort of dizziness - About a week or so after he came home one night he woke me up I found him acting as though he was struggling jerking up his feet and hands; foaming at the mouth and biting. That was the first one I had seen him have and went and called my mother. And she came and bathed his head with cold water and for the first year after that he seemed to have those spells come on him once or twice a month, generally at night. I did not see him much during the day. After he would come to he would appear stupid. And then for the next two or three years he did not seem to have them quite so often, probably once a month, and some times skipped, and after that had them twice and three times a month as long as I slept with him. Dr. Johnson ^{deceased} came to see him while we lived near ~~Randall's~~ ^{Randall's} ~~town~~. Since 1879 I have not seen him have any fits or I only see him occasionally. I never heard ~~heard~~ ^{heard} of him having had fits before he went into the Army. He had belonged to John Tolly's ^{company}.
