I had always <sup>lived home</sup> up to ten years  
ago, and the only member of our  
family beside (Alant) that I knew  
to be sick, was my mother had  
always been troubled in her  
time with cramps and loose-  
ness of bowels, but never had  
any fainting spells, or fits,  
from the time my brother came  
home from the Army to 1873 we  
 slept together. He came home  
with his arm in a sling, and says,
