our Company lay, nearly the whole winter across the river from Yorktown Va. at a place named Fort Magruder. I think that was the name. And a fort at Gloucester, whose name I forget, we were at both of those forts. We were garrisoning the fort at Williamsburg that winter doing ordinary guard duty. Stading picket - I believe we did a little digging on the trenches at Fort Magruder, not a great deal though - I don't remember Fry being there. Thought he may have been. Don't remember anything happening about at either fort. - I saw him digging trenches at Spring Hill, after the Mine Explosion at Petersburg in July 1864. There was nothing more the matter with him other than he complained of feeling sick <sup>as he did</sup> after we went to Yorktown, but don't know what was the matter with him. Don't remember ever seeing him have fits in service. Never saw him fall from a scappold or platform while in service and never heard
