I became acquainted with Jesse
Fry about 1865, just about the
 close of the war. I was then engaged
 in the lumber business at Harrison-
ville, Baltimore Co. and Jesse
drove my wagon. - I think he
 was in my employ for about
 one year. And then about 1875
 or 1876, he was again in my em-
 ploy for a short time, only a
 few months - he then worked on
 my farm.

At the time he drove for me,
 at the close of the war, - I noticed
 that he was generally debilitated, was
 not strong, he simply drove. The
 wagon was generally loaded and
 unloaded by other parties. - About
 the first evidence I had of his having
 anything serious the matter with
 him was in the summer of the
 year he worked for me, while
 driving along the road, he while
 on the saddle horse, was taken
