went to detail the next day but in a day or two after when I was detailed to that work again. And after trying to labor, finding I could not overcome the pain and swelling of my wrist, I got excused. I remained there at Fort Wagner from December 1863 to July 1864. - And after I fell down one day's guard duty and as I could not handle the gun on account of my swollen wrist, I was excused from duty during the remainder of the service. - Not one day while I was sitting in the Cook tent at the Fort, either the early part of July or Feb'y 1864. It was that first had one of those spells, or epileptic fits. I can't tell you how I felt while it was coming on. When I came to I was partly sitting up. I had been sitting on side of the bunk, when the spell came on. - When I came to I felt stupid and bad, and my head and left side pained me and my tongue was kind of sore. - Several Banks, David Campbell and several others were there at the time and said that I foamed at the mouth, but did not tell me how long I had been in that condition.
